

Honoring colleague Rana Al-Jalal for receiving the Excellence Award in Scientific Research from the Sciences Po University in Paris

Al-Jalal was selected from among approximately 300 students with Masters Degrees on a worldwide level, the research paper was prepared under the supervision of Dr. Nayef Al-Shammari, who is a member of the Faculty of Economics at the Faculty of Administrative Sciences at Kuwait University.

She said that the research she submitted in the competition is titled "The Impact of Immigrants on the Volume of Trade in the Middle East and North Africa". The study included data for a group of Arab countries in the Middle East and North Africa region during the period 1990-2015, statistical analysis was used to analyze the relationship.

Al-Jalal pointed out that the award is part of a Kuwait Program at the Sciences Po University, in which the two have a mutual partnership which is between the Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS) and the Sciences Po University in Paris. It includes close cooperation between academics, students and decision makers from the State of Kuwait and the University in Paris.
